### [The BeltLine](#)

The Atlanta BeltLine is a sustainable redevelopment project that is transforming the city. It will ultimately connect 45 intown neighborhoods via a 22-mile loop of multi-use trails, modern streetcar, and parks – all based on railroad corridors that formerly encircled Atlanta. Connecting points on the Eastside Trail are located from Piedmont Park to Krog Street Market and goes through Ponce City Market.

## [Carter Presidential Center](#)

The Carter Center is located in a 35-acre park approximately two miles east of downtown Atlanta. Four circular interconnected pavilions house offices for the former president and the first lady and most of the center's program staff. The Complex includes the nondenominational Cecil B. Day Chapel, other conference facilities, and staff offices. The Center also owns the nearby Kirbo Building and leases other office space from the city of Atlanta for The Atlanta Project and The America Project. The Jimmy Carter Library and Museum, which adjoins The Carter Center, is owned and operated by the National Archives and Records Administration of the Federal Government. The Center and Library are known collectively as The Carter Presidential Center.

## [Centennial Olympic Park](#)

The 21-acre Centennial Olympic Park was developed to serve as the world's gathering place during the Centennial Olympic Games in 1996. The park has become a civic symbol and community focal point as well as a catalyst for new development in the downtown area. The park includes SkyView Atlanta, a 200-ft Ferris Wheel with 42 air-conditioned cars and views of the park and city. Expansion and re-development of Centennial Olympic Park expected to be completed in 2019 includes the addition of an amphitheater, more entrances to the park, and sculptures paying homage to the Olympics.

## [Mercedes-Benz Stadium](#)

Located in the heart of Atlanta, the Mercedes-Benz Stadium, a multi-purpose retractable roof stadium, is the home of the NFL's Atlanta Falcons and MLS's Atlanta United. The stadium is owned by the state of Georgia through the GWCCA, and operated by AMB Group, who own the Falcons and United. The stadium annually hosts the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game(s), SEC Football Championship, and the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, and also will host or has hosted the 2018 College Football Playoff National Championship, Super Bowl LIII in 2019, and the 2020 NCAA Basketball Final Four. Mercedes-Benz Stadium replaced the Georgia Dome in 2017.
